I know we don't have snow...yet but

if you have been following the Leacroft Facebook page, you may have noticed that several of our neighbors have been having problems with water pipes. I have a few suggestions that might help

1. Know where your water cutoff valves are. You probably have at least two. One is normally near your hot water heater. It normally has a red handle. (Stop now and locate this valve if you are not sure where it is.) Now go back and turn the valve off by turning it clockwise until it stops. Now go back in your kitchen and turn on the water. It should run for a few seconds and then go off. You now how to turn off the water in the house. (Be sure to turn the water back on) This valve will not turn off any outside water pipes such as irrigation systems.

There is another valve that is normally near the curb. It is under a cover, normally green, and is located next to the water meter. This valve will turn off all of the water





to your property. When you have a leak, knowing where these valves are and how to use them may minimize your damage.

2. Replace old connecting pipes. The water pipes to your toilets and washing machine are often the guilty party in a house flooding. The original pipes were cheap plastic ones and often break. You may want to consider replacing these pipes with more durable ones. The toilet pipe is normally on the lower left side of the tank. There is a valve for turning off the water when replacing the pipe. There are two pipes for the washing machine (hot and cold). The connections are located in a box behind your machine. They also have a valve for turning off the water when replacing the pipes. The replacement pipes are reasonably inexpensive and are fairly easy to replace.





3. Turn off the water in you home when you are gone for an extended period of time. Connie and I always turn of the water before going on vacation. I know this may seem a little excessive but after hearing accounts of pipes breaking when you are gone for a couple of weeks might make you rethink about taking this simple step.

- 4. Allow a light stream of water to run from your kitchen sink faucet on particularly cold nights. This is particularly true when your kitchen sink is on an outside wall. Running water may prevent the pipes from freezing.
- 5. Cover outside spigots (faucets). Outside spigots will freeze in very cold weather. You can buy inexpensive spigot covers at Lowe's or Home Depot. If you can't find them, wrap an old towel or sock around the spigot and cover with a plastic bag (perhaps a grocery bag) and seal with tape. The idea is to protect the spigot from the cold air and wind. When you cover the spigots be sure to disconnect your water hoses. They too will freeze.
- 6. Know a plumber. Knowing a good plumber before you need one is a good idea. If you know a good plumber and would recommend him to others, let me know and I will put his name in out Leacroft List.
- 7. Have your HVAC system examined by a reputable repair shop. It is a good practice to have your heating and air conditioning system checked out in the spring and fall—before anticipated periods of extreme low (or high temperatures in the summer), when consumer demand for repairs to HVAC systems are the highest. These inspections may save you money and keep you from frustration when you really need your system to be working. Get you air conditioning system checked in April and the heating system checked in September. Technicians are not as busy then and can get to you a bit faster.

warm. (forecast said mid 50's in Charlotte this week. I am so-oooo ready.

And I was so—ooo wrong. I didn't count on this so-called "arctic freeze" that is gripping the entire country.

On to plan B..

Went outside to check the garden boxes. Everything looked okay thanks to the hard work I put in at the end of the season.
